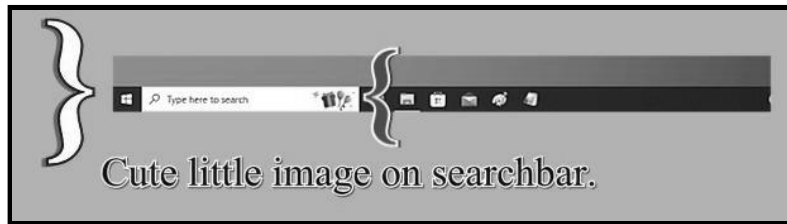


## Hey Microsoft, If we wanted cartoons we would read the comics. Toggle Search Highlights On/Off



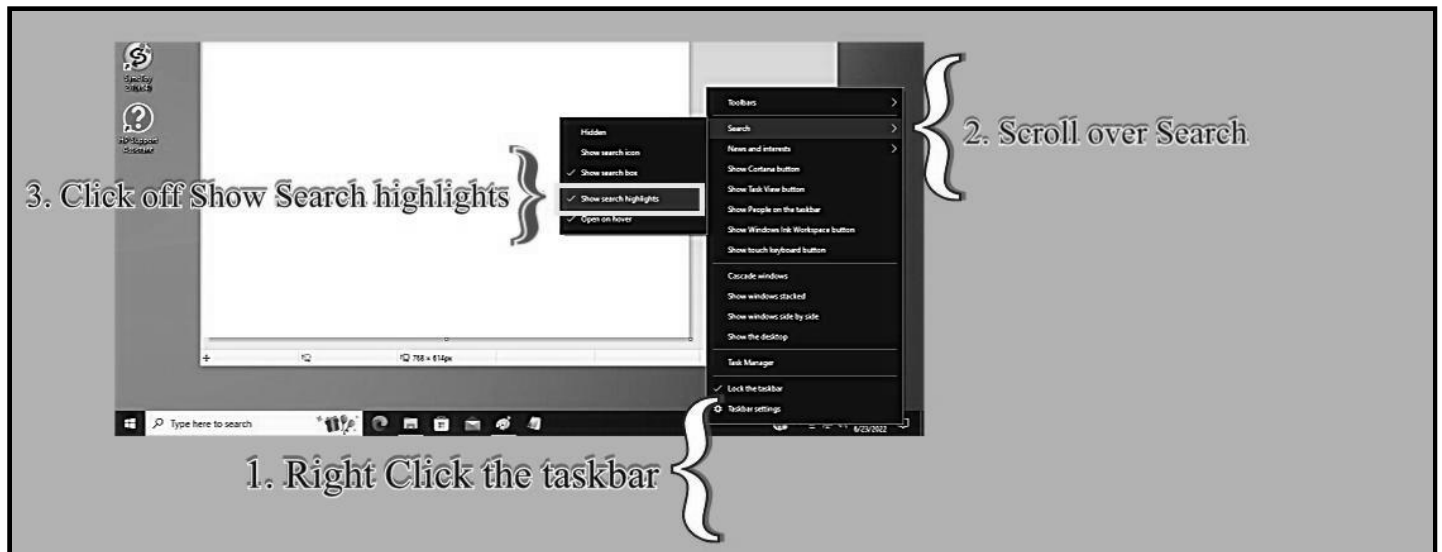

Step 2 is Mouse over Search from the context menu that appears.  
Step 3 is Click Off "**Show searchhighlights.**"
